Church Life ... Community Health Update

On Monday, November 14, Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Kieran Moore, strongly recommended that people start to wear masks in all indoor public settings, including in schools and child-care settings. The Windsor-Essex County Health Unit also supports this practice and states "mask use in public settings is one small action that can help to mitigate the concerning respiratory illness trends we have seen rising in our community since early November." We, at NLUMC, feel it is necessary to follow public health recommendations and so we also suggest wearing a mask indoors in public settings.
