◆ Congregational Discernment Exercise

NLUMC is in a time of transition and re-start in 2022/23. How do we find new energy going forward and can we be candid about any challenges we are facing? We have invited Pastor Al Rempel, MCEC Regional Minister to lead us through a Discernment approach outlining the many strong gifts that our congregation envelops.

Timeframe:

- 1. Launch on December 11, 2022 message: Appreciating our Liminal Spaces.
- 2. Congregational Exercise now through the Christmas timeframe (low threshold item placing your thoughts on a sticky note and placing on the 3D tree at the front of the sanctuary.)

We will be following a Discerning Approach

Following is the underlying method of a Discerning approach:

Appreciative Inquiry is a tool that invites people into a space that looks for what is going well and where energy and positive things are happening. Central to the method is a belief that God is already at work in our community in wonderful ways and our task is not to invent opportunities for God to work but to recognize and align with God's moves today and in the future. Our approach is not to look at what we are not, but to appreciate who we are and what we are uniquely and well gifted to become.

The following outline of assumptions helps individuals to appreciate the difference between a common Deciding approach to a Discerning approach.

A Deciding Approach — Assumptions:

- Most problems are solvable if approached carefully and logically.
- We have the capacity to understand and solve our own problems and embrace our own opportunities
- Maximizing the use of available resources is important
- Maintaining or restoring order is important

A Discerning Approach — Assumptions

• God is not neutral about our mission or our choices

- God is self-disclosing
- The Holy Spirit is our indwelling and ongoing guide.
- Openness of spirit and attitude is required
- God's will is revealed in community. (Taken from "How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going" – Susan Beaumont)

2. Congregational Exercise:

What is it about NLUMC that has been a blessing to you - and continues to be energizing to you as an individual?

We are invited to take part in a Prayer Exercise - and the building of a "sticky note tree!"

Each person should listen for God to share with them how NLUMC has been a gift and blessing to them.

Each individual is invited to write a short description of that on a sticky note which can be stuck to our 3D tree at the front of the Sanctuary. The multiple colours of sticky notes will be a wonderful image representing our diversities!

3. Mark your calendar for Sunday, January 15 to take part in the worship service, pot-luck lunch and afternoon meeting. Message: *Aspiring to follow God in our discipleship* followed by potluck lunch and then a short afternoon talk session: What is already part of our DNA that creates a context for support and encourages us in our aspirations moving forward?

Church Council will continue our discussions as we prepare for these conversations, and we look forward to Pastor Al Rempel facilitating us through this journey. If you have any thoughts or ideas, please contact someone on Church Council to discuss further.
