

Church Life ...

♦ Community Health Update

On Monday, November 14, Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Kieran Moore, strongly recommended that people start to wear masks in all indoor public settings, including in schools and child-care settings. The Windsor-Essex County Health Unit also supports this practice and states "mask use in public settings is one small action that can help to mitigate the concerning respiratory illness trends we have seen rising in our community since early November." We, at NLUMC, feel it is necessary to follow public health recommendations and so we also suggest wearing a mask indoors in public settings. Masks are available in the church foyer for the benefit of all.

♦ Third Sunday of Advent, December 11, Congregational Discernment Exercise. Pastor Al Rempel, MCEC Regional Minister is leading NLUMC in a Congregational Discernment Exercise today Sunday, December 11, 2022 and Sunday, January 15, 2023.

Our hope is to be candid about the challenges we are facing and find new energies for what the Holy Spirit is calling us to. There are probably a lot of assumptions that people have, and we want to openly name how each of us may be feeling and what we are thinking during this time of transition. Timeframe: Part 1, December 11, 2022, Message: *Liminal Spaces - What are our blessings and what continues to be energizing to us at NLUMC?* Congregational exercises (very low threshold items) to be carried out in the four-week timeframe from December 11 to January 15 - eg. creating a sticky note tree with congregants' ideas, in order to follow emerging themes.

Part 2, January 15, 2023, Message: *Aspiring to follow God in our discipleship* followed by potluck lunch and then a short afternoon talk session: What is already part of our DNA that creates a context for support and encourages us in our aspirations moving forward?

Church Council will continue our discussions as we prepare for these conversations, and we look forward to Pastor Al Rempel facilitating us through this journey. If you have any thoughts or ideas, please contact someone on Church Council to discuss further.
