

Missions Team is reminding us of the continued and immense need for support in the areas hit by severe earthquakes in early February. ▶ We also wanted to share an update on the The Leamington Community Hope Center operating at the former Knox Presbyterian Church and how NLUMC can help. Missions Team met with Merissa Mills from Feeding Windsor Essex and Wolfgang Weber, Executive Director of the Center on February 14.

A drop-in program is offered daily between 6 and 10 pm with a meal of soup, buns, fresh fruit, vegetables and snacks. In mid February they had 27 people come in for supper and numbers are growing.

They are primarily serving people between 30-40 years of age and a few seniors.

Donations of personal hygiene products and clothing would be appreciated, especially men's pants or jeans in sizes 28 to 36. Old cell phones wiped of all data, packaged snacks and underwear for men and women would also be appreciated.

They have a good roster of volunteers but could use more to cover off when people are on vacation. Both women and men would be welcome and those with the ability to speak Spanish would be particularly helpful. Five volunteers are required for each shift, starting at 5:45 and ending at 10:30 pm. The Center for Hope is working together with other Homelessness services in Leamington and their goal is to fill in gaps where needed. Donations of cash, cheques, gift cards (with receipts) and other items with receipts would be welcome and can be receipted for charitable donations.
