♦ Local Canadian Foodgrains Bank Update

Thank you to all for your support of the Foodgrains Bank in an effort to end world hunger. Here is a quick update of our local efforts for 2023. Our local project for 2023 was three fields; Tiessen family grew corn, Epp family and Agris Co-op (which is led by Chad Recker) grew soybeans. 18.3 acres in total which yielded 2,842 bushels which we sold for a gross of \$22,674.

We also received generous donations; \$10,126 towards our project expenses and \$7,888 was donated at the rollkuchen and watermelon event. This, by the way, was a well attended event. Lots of volunteers and everyone wants us to do it again next year. Last year we held it on the 3rd week of June and it worked out well. Stay tuned. Total revenue of \$40,688. Expenses were; \$8,756 for the crops and \$664 for the rollkuchen event. Net; \$32,866 which we sent to Foodgrains Bank.

We retain a balance of \$3,755 to get next year's projects started.
