♦ Anabaptism - 500 Years

On January 21, 1525, a small group of Christians secretly gathered in Zurich for a worship service. There they experienced voluntary baptism as adults, with the full understanding that this decision implied a transformation of life in the way of Jesus. For many, this decision led to imprisonment, torture, and even death. But this gathering also marked the beginning of the Anabaptist movement that continues today in the form of the Amish, Hutterites, Mennonites, Church of the Brethren, and other related groups. 2025 marks the 500 year Anniversary of Anabaptism! MennoMedia and CommonWord have many resources available as we join together with all Anabaptists who are passionately pursuing unity and ensuring that Anabaptist thought and practices continue to thrive for generations to come. We are excited about how we may all participate in what God is doing through our communities. To commemorate this special occasion, a special Anabaptist Bible has been compiled.
