Church Life . . .

♦ Next Sunday, June 29

▶ 10 am, Join us for the beginning of this year's summer series called **Breaking Religion**. Lindsey Ecker will lead worship and Chris will bring the message. The book of Galatians is the earliest document we have in the New Testament, and in this letter, the apostle Paul addresses the challenge of how we live with our rituals, rules, and regulations. Did Jesus come to bring a whole new set of religious rules, or did he come to bring something vastly different and world-changing?

▶ Membership Meeting, immediately following the morning worship service on Sunday, June 29. As you may be aware, Ontario's Not-for-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA) replaced Ontario's Corporations Act on October 19, 2021, providing existing not-for-profits in Ontario with a transition period to make necessary changes to their governing documents.

As NLUMC's By-laws were last reviewed and revised on February 7, 2021, these By-laws require updating to comply with ONCA, to reflect current NLUMC practices and to provide future flexibility.

NLUMC's Articles (previously known as "Letters Patent"), dated 1981, have never been amended and the Articles, not the By-laws, are the appropriate document in which to specify how many Directors/Church Council members NLUMC wishes to have. Accordingly, our Articles require updating to reflect our desired maximum number of Church Council members (fifteen, being our current maximum) and our desired minimum (three, reflective of the minimum specified under ONCA).

Accordingly, the By-law Sub-committee of NLUMC Church Council, in consultation with its legal counsel, Michael Wiens of Sawatzky's LLP, has prepared the attached By-law No. 1 and Articles of Amendment for Members' review prior to the upcoming Members meeting, when the following motions will be put to Members for a vote: "That the Members of North Leamington United Mennonite Church approve By-law No. 1 as drafted" [or as amended, if applicable] and "That the Members of North Leamington United Mennonite Church approve the Articles of Amendment as drafted" [or as amended, if applicable].

Should you have any questions or comments relating to either document, we encourage you to direct them to Dennis Dick by email to ddick1706@gmail.com in advance of the meeting, so that we may have the opportunity to address them in the meantime and run a more efficient meeting.
