◆ Canadian Foodgrains Bank News

As you may know, 20 million people in Somalia, South Sudan, Nigeria and Yemen are facing famine. It's being called the largest humanitarian crisis in over 70 years. Canadian Foodgrains Bank is responding. Since January, we have provided \$2.5 million of help for over 70,000 people. But more needs to be done. **Until June 30, the Canadian government is offering a 1:1 match** on every gift given towards famine relief in places we are working in such as South Sudan, Nigeria and Somalia. This includes donations sent to us from offerings in our supporting churches. These funds will go into the government's Famine Relief Fund, which will be made available to relief groups like the Foodgrains Bank. This is on top of the usual 4:1 match that we get from the

Canadian government for our food aid work in the developing world. **With the two matching funds, your \$1 turns into \$6.**

You can donate through the church by making your cheque payable to NLUMC and specify Canadian Foodgrains Bank on the “other” line of your offering envelope. These special donations will be collected at church until June 26, 2017, after which time they will be sent in.

◆ **Sound System Update**

After considerable research with various technical and sound businesses, and discussion with local area churches as per their systems, Church Council feels that we have arrived at a suitable solution for our sound needs. A quote of \$83,000 will ensure that we have quality speakers, monitors and new microphones, audio sound on website (so people can listen to sermon as opposed to reading on-line), choir loft monitors, lobby screen and monitor for overflow seating, video camera transmission to the Mennonite Home Complex

(many of our seniors have requested this option,) and improved clarity and crisp sound for those who have difficulty hearing with our current system.

Council would like to request ‘special donations’ to the Sound Project! We would like to have the donations in-hand and/or pledged in order to proceed with this project in Fall 2017.

People can consider giving in various ways: “in memory” of a loved one; having funeral donations earmarked to North Leamington Sound Project; and/or setting up estate bequests to NLUMC. As well, designated donations can be earmarked on offering envelopes: “Sound Project.” NLUMC has received an estate bequest in the amount of \$40,000 earmarked for the Sound Project. We are very grateful for this generous donation to launch the sound system and we pray that we can raise the remainder over the next several months. Our current account balance for the Sound Project is \$50,410.
