Ethiopian Fundraiser. GREAT food. Eating without utensils. Sharing 1. our kitchen with an Ethiopian church. Raising \$2,694.80. "Semen Meserete Kristos Church (meaning, North Christ the Foundation Church) is one of the near 500 Mennonite Affiliated Churches in Ethiopia. There are near 1000 memberships and 20 different ministries under our local church. Our adolescent and youth ministry is headed by a very talented and committed full time minister--Endalk. They provide holistic support to high school and college/university students--especially during their summer vacation. We're very much happy to share our experience. Your designated financial support will be used to establish the most needed computer unit in our local church. Currently, we have a small library with few old spiritual, academic and fiction books. Based on your support, we planned to arrange a wider room for library--fairly furnished, with eight computers (loaded with soft copy spiritual and academic materials such as E-books), print materials/books and other relevant/related materials. We also planned to avail internet service. We believe the funds you raised will suffice to visualize our computer lab dream.
