Sunday School teachers, parents, and interested others are invited and encouraged to attend this informative workshop. We will be preparing for the year ahead by reviewing NLUMC's Safe Church Policy and informing our church community about the *Circles of Grace* program that will be taught in Sunday School this year. *Circles of Grace* is a MCC sponsored curriculum being taught in MCEC churches to help reduce the risk of abuse by educating children about safety in fun, age appropriate ways. We will have the opportunity to discuss what this curriculum is and address questions. It will be taught about once a month on three Sundays during Fall 2017.


