- ▶ 8 am Breakfast for the ushers, sound people and video people in the church basement.
- ► Adult Education coffee at 8:45 am, class at 9 am, Wrestling with The Word. The Bible is both an inspired model for our spiritual journeys and a book that raises some controversial questions for us. Pastor Kendall will lead us in

adult education as we talk about what the Bible is and isn't and what to do with difficult questions. Today is the final session in this series.

Next Sunday, October 21 —

- ▶ Mindful Movement for Mental Health Intergenerational class. Begins Sunday, October 21 with coffee at 8:45, class at 9 am. Learn to be fully present in God's presence by experiencing mindfulness (mindful awareness) through the five senses of taste, touch, smell, sound and sight. Each week we will look at one of the senses and how we connect to God and our emotions in a balanced way. We will enter into the mindfulness time each week beginning with breathing, gentle movements, balancing and prayer. We will end each week with a prayer and an activity to complete individually or as a family. This is suited to everyone ages 8-108 (or maturity level that can participate in these types of activities.) We will have classes on October 21, 28, November 4, 18 & 25. Let Lindsey Ecker know if you have questions or would like to participate so she knows how many materials to bring each week.
- ▶ 10 am Mark 7:24-30 is a challenging story where Jesus does not come off looking nice. As he encounters a foreign woman, she challenges his cultural bias with the phrase "even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Come explore with Pastor Charleen this encounter with Jesus quite possibly a grumpy, irritable, very human Jesus who needed to have his sense of mission challenged and expanded. Sermon Title: Challenge and Change: a lesson from the Crumbs.
