He is the first member of his family who has chosen to follow Christ and worked closely with Jeff and Tany Warkentin during their six years of service with the MC Canada Witness program in Ouagadougou. While Bananzaro has reached the age where he could retire from his Bible translation career, he wants to first complete a translation project which would make the word of God available in his mother tongue language. He has been an instrumental church leader among the Mennonite churches in Burkina Faso and has pastored the Ouagadougou Mennonite Church for the past 10 years. Bananzaro and his wife Noellie, have five children and three granddaughters.

Youth ...

▶ Notes from the meeting about Youth Ministry, April 14, 2019

This is a brief summary of the key learnings from our meeting about Youth Ministry. These items were repeated several times by a number of people. There were about 30 people present at the meeting including two Senior Youth and two Junior Youth. There were also several parents of Senior and Junior Youth.

- Consistent events are important. Events should be held weekly.
- Youth Bible Studies are important. Separate Bible studies should be held for Junior and Senior Youth.
- Adult volunteers are important. Effort should be made to develop a team of committed volunteer youth sponsors.
- It's important to have a consistent leader for the youth ministries.
- This group feels strongly that a Youth Pastor position is important staff hours should be dedicated to this ministry. It is important that this person has the gifts, skills, and calling needed to do Youth Ministry.
- Developing relationships between older and younger people is important. There need to be opportunities for youth to develop relationship with adults and with younger youth and children.
- A service component is an important aspect of the Youth ministry.

- ▶ You are invited to consider **hosting a Junior or Senior youth event next year.** "Hosting" looks like providing space for an event to happen. It can also mean preparing snacks or helping to organize activities (i.e. marshmallow roast and campfire, with opportunity to play Gorgon or Sardines). Past events that worked well included going for a walk outside a snowy forest at a host's home, having a drumming circle around a campfire, playing games outside in the forest, and enjoying a pool party. Hosts need to be in communication with youth leader about games and snacks but don't necessarily have to organize all of it themselves.
- ▶ We also need several **volunteer youth sponsors** who can commit to regularly showing up at events throughout the year in order to build relationships with the youth. Youth sponsors can help supervise events, ensure safety, and be a friendly adult for youth to talk with. It's important for youth

sponsors to regularly attend youth activities because relationships take time to develop.
