- ▶ Thanks to Joel Epp for introducing our next collection project which is Southwestern Ontario Gleaners. Their mandate is to convert unmarketable produce into dehydrated vegetable soup and fruit snacks. This week we sent \$300 to The Gleaners. This is enough to provide 3000 servings. We have made a commitment in the Sunday School to help feed the hungry.

Circle of Grace is a developmentally appropriate Christian safe environment program for children, intended to prevent sexual abuse in our children. The Circle of Grace program helps children and youth to identify early on when they are uncomfortable with a situation and includes ways to seek help from a trusted adult.
