Sunday, November 3

▶ 10 am — "I'm Sorry!" The role of apology in forgiveness. Many of us have an inadequate, or weak understanding of what it means to forgive. Maybe we were told to say "I'm sorry!" and/or were forced to forgive with an easy hug when the hurt was still stinging. The thing is, "I'm sorry" is not enough for forgiveness to flourish. On Sunday, November 3, we will explore how to give and receive a good, truth-filled apology, and how that might set the stage for building peace when we're in the wrong. This knowledge is good for our marriages, our families, our friendships, and frankly, all our relationships. Romans 18:17 "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all" and other texts. Pastor Charleen preaching, Keith Klassen leading worship. Adult Sunday School continues the conversation on forgiveness.
