▶ 10 am — 495 years ago, on January 21, 1525, early anabaptists in Zurich rebaptized each other; an event which marks a beginning for the anabaptist movement. Anabaptist World Fellowship Sunday (formerly Mennonite World Fellowship Sunday) honours our history, and our global fellowship of churches. The theme is *Jesus Christ: Our Hope*, and our text is from Lamentations 3:19-26, a reflection on hope in times of despair. We will be sharing Communion.
