Church Council wants to address the news that the Ontario government is allowing limited in person worship in church buildings. At this point we do not anticipate worshipping in our church building this summer. Because the limitations are so understandably stringent (a limit of a third of building capacity, no congregational singing, children required to be with their parents at all times, no possibility of coffee time conversations, physical distancing in and between pews, considerable additional cleaning) the risks, particularly for our vulnerable members, seem to outweigh the benefits at this time. Just because we are allowed to gather to worship doesn't mean we should. We will continue to worship online as Church Council monitors this situation moving forward.

The church building is now closed. The church secretary, Susan Klassen, is now working from home. If you have any questions, please call the church office, 519-326-7928 and leave a message. The phone messages are checked daily. Canada Post mail is picked up regularly. Emails are checked daily. The bulletin should be available online on Friday afternoon. The pastors are also working from home. ### ◆ **Looking Forward – Appreciating where we have come...**

Pastor Kendall and Pastor Charleen have been with us for two years! It is hard to believe that two years have passed and it also feels like they have been with us for many years! As announced at the Annual General Meeting in February the two-year mark is the time to review Pastor Charleen and Pastor Kendall's ministry at NLUMC. Your participation is very important for us to discern God's call for our community. You are the community that receives our pastors' ministry so your feedback will help to shape and guide their work and development as a pastor going forward. Thank you for your investment in our shared experience!

#### **Process:**

The primary method for hearing the input from you as a congregation will be through focus groups. You are invited to participate in a guided discussion that will seek to hear your input around a set of questions we have developed with the support of MCEC. The questions are designed to hear you speak to that which you find most beneficial and valuable as a member of the community of faith. This method of asking questions is sometimes referred to as appreciative inquiry. The evaluation of your responses provides very constructive feedback both for the community and the pastors. While the questions are positively framed, the generated outcome is a constructive set of responses that invite reflection, growth and focused effort. It shares items that are seen very positively currently and invites questions as to why other aspects of ministry are not mentioned in this way and how strengths can be leveraged for future growth.

The Personnel Team, Helga Enns, Victor Huebert and Joanne Brown, will be reaching out to NLUMC members to lead focus groups that will meet in September/October. These focus group leaders will be members of a short term committee, the Pastoral Review Team.

Focus group leaders will be inviting you to participate in a group session at their home, or virtually via video technology. It is our hope that all members of the congregation can participate in a focus group session. If you are not able to, you may submit your responses individually to the Personnel Team members, preferably via email and with your signature. We are having a conversation together and so we want to talk for ourselves and the focus groups are optimum for also allowing us to hear how others are thinking too. Each voice is important so creating opportunities for participation will make sure your input is gathered.

The work of the Pastoral Review Team will be to evaluate what is gathered through this process and report first to the pastor and then council who will share the results with you as a congregation.

#### **Preparation:**

We invite you to prepare for the focus group and/or the responding to the questions by prayerfully inviting God to help you listen and speak well into this important exercise. (Your prayers for the leaders of the process are much appreciated too.) We invite you to also read the NLUMC Pastor job description so that you know how Pastor Kendall and Pastor Charleen are currently working in our congregation. This will help you to see and evaluate the contributions the pastors are making.

#### **While this is a process of hearing your voice, it is also a process for us to listen:**

- to hear what others value,
- to hear how God is working through us that is responding to needs within our setting, and
- to hear how being part of this community is a way that we are participating in God's work of saving a world in need of love, healing and peace.

#### **The questions that we will consider in this review process:**

1. Describe a time in the past year [or other period being reviewed] when you felt especially pleased to be part of this congregation and its mission and ministry. What did you value most about the congregation in that situation?
2. Recall a time in the pastor's ministry [during the period being reviewed] when you felt s/he was at her/his best. Describe that situation. What was it about the pastor's ministry that you especially appreciated or found to be particularly effective?
3. From your perspective, what are the two or three most important contributions that the pastor is currently making to this congregation's mission and ministry?

4. Given your knowledge of the pastor's gifts and our congregation's current vision and expectations:
  - a. Where do you think the pastor should be focusing his/her energies over the next several years? (If possible, explain your thinking in terms of the congregation's vision and expectations.)
  - b. In which area(s) would you like to see the pastor grow in ministry?
  - c. What gifts does the pastor have that we are not using, which could contribute to our spiritual growth and to the mission and vision of our congregation?
  - d. How can we as a congregation strengthen our pastor's ministry and our ministry as pastor and congregation together?
5. Name two or three places where you believe God's Spirit is moving, calling us as a congregation to grow spiritually and in our ministry and mission. If the congregation discerned the same, what role might the pastor play in leading us in these directions? What role might the congregation play?
6. Is there anything else we would benefit from hearing from you with respect to the pastors' ministry at NLUMC?

**Putting it together:**

1. In what area of our congregational life and ministry would you like to see more growth?
  - a. What role might Pastors Kendall and Charleen play helping lead us in these directions?
  - b. What role might the congregation play?
