Safety measures include:

- COVID screening upon entry to the church
- only the West parking lot doors (with handicapped button) will be used
- masks **must** be worn over the mouth and nose at all times
- floor markings and seating assistance by ushers to maintain physical distancing
- hand sanitizer at entrances and washrooms
- disinfectant available in washrooms for users to clean what they touch
- access to the basement areas closed
- no congregational singing

♦ MCC Meat Canner News

The current pandemic has not stopped requests to MCC for food. In response, the MCC Meat Canner is on the road and canning in the U.S. on a reduced schedule, reduced capacity and with as few volunteers as possible. The Learnington Meat Canner Committee has started to look at the possibilities and obstacles in front of us for canning safely here in Learnington. We ask you to please pray for the safety of everyone involved with the Meat Canner in the U.S.

◆ 2023 Russlaender Centenary Tour. To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the migration of 21,000 Mennonites from Russia to Canada beginning in 1923, a committee of the Mennonite Historical Society of Canada is organizing a cross-Canada train tour for summer 2023. The tour comprises three segments, 7-days from Quebec City to Kitchener, 8 days from Toronto to Winnipeg and on to Saskatoon and 5 days from Saskatoon to Abbotsford, BC. Each leg of the tour includes informative historical presentations, tours and events, plus banquets, Sängerfests and interaction with local Mennonites.
